


Financial Summary

Thanks to grants and donor support, HAT's financial position continues to be strong and stable. The overall loss for the 2015-2016 fiscal year is a result of a significant unrestricted donation at the end of the previous year (2014-2015), most of which was spent this fiscal year. This is reflected in a substantial net operating surplus for the 2014-2015 fiscal year.

Income (2015-2016)





Expenses (2015-2016)

Program Highlights

Land Protection and Habitat Management

The **Land Protection Program** conserved nature by permanently protecting natural areas through covenants, and working to ensure those natural areas are resilient and intact.



- Successfuly monitored all 16 covenants that fall under HAT's mandate.
- Collaborated with our Sooke Hills covenant partners, CRD Parks and TLC during a monitoring hike to Mt. Quimper
- In final stages of negotiaion for one new covenant in Metchosin to be completed by April 2017.
- Coordinated 276 community volunteers that spent 71 hours each (18, 815 volunteer hours total) removing 140 square meters of invasive plants and planted over 180 native plants in 12 HAT covenants and other significant natural sites.
- Coordinated educational and restoration activites at HAT-owned Matson Conservation Area in Victoria's Harbour in partnership with Matson Mattocks Stewardship group.

Habitat Stewardship: Green Spots



The **Green Spots Program** helped schools and students understand and care for nature through hands-on, outdoor activity.

- HAT worked with over 425 students at Ecole Marigold Elementary, Lansdowne Middle School, Central Middle School, and South Park Family School to improve natural habitat on school grounds.
- HAT planted over 550 native plants and hundreds of seeds at Garry Oak Ecosystem sites at Ecole Marigold Elementary and South Park Family School in partnership with the City of Victoria, District of Saanich Salvage Program, the School District, Ministry of Transportation, Saanich Native Plants, and Cheryl Bryce of the Songhees First Nation.
- A First Nation drumming and dance ceremony was held on planting day at South Park Family School to bless a successful planting with the students and their families.



Program Highlights

Habitat Stewardship: Good Neighbours Ayum Creek

Through the **Good Neighbours Program**, HAT collaborated with partners at the T'sou-ke Ladybug Community Garden to plant a pollinator hedgerow with over 35 volunteers.



- Provided personalized advice to 42 landowners to help them care for nature on their land – 4 special stewards completed handson HAT-assisted Stewardship Projects!
- Signed up 21 households to become Habitat Stewards committing to best practices to care for nature.
- In partnership with CRD Parks, Pacific Salmon Foundation, and the Juan de Fuca Community Trails Society, HAT hosted Ayum Creek 2-Day Riparian Restoration Workshop. 46 members of the community enjoyed a salmon walk and talk, and provided over 200 volunteer hours restoring the forest alongside spawning chum salmon.
- In partnership with the T'sou-ke First
 Nation, Saanich Native Plants, and Juan de
 Fuca Community Association, we installed
 a hedgerow with 65 native shrubs and 250
 wildflowers!

Habitat Stewardship: Species of Concern



The **Species of Concern Program** helped species that are facing immediate threats through education, habitat enhancement & restoration.

- Western Painted turtle sites were detected at three new sites.
- Three new Western Screech Owl occurrences detected; and 30 boxes are currently being installed on private property.
- Counted 7412 bats this summer, and installed over 25 bat boxes.
- Areas of high amphibians roadkill were surveyed & mitigation measures are being assessed.
- Habitat was identified, monitored and enhanced for Western Painted Turtles, Bluegrey taildropper and Sharp-tailed Snake.

Habitat Stewardship: Goldstream Chums



Through the **Goldstream Chums Program**, HAT created opportunities for thousands of local students to experience salmon runs first-hand with educators.

- Supported by over 10 local community businesses and individuals donating at a variety of levels contributing over \$9000 towards our salmon run education programs at the Goldstream Nature House.
- Over 6000 students participated in the Goldstream Nature House salmon run school programs (over 200 classes from south Vancouver Island)
- Welcomed over 35,000 visitors through the doors during the salmon run season, October until early December.

- Celebrated HAT's 20th year in Conservation at Musical HATs (Nov 8; 77 guests, \$5,200 raised)
- Native Plant Garden Tour (May 2; 200+ attendees)
- Member Lunch (June 16; 62 members present)
- Wildlife Night (Sept 21; 27 attendees)
- Habitat Guardian Campaign; raised \$10,500 for land protection
