





2013-2014 Expenses









Programs

Land Protection: Covenants & Acquisitions

The Land Protection program conserves nature by permanently protecting natural areas through pruchase and covenant, and working to ensure those natural areas are resilient and intact.



Highlights

- New covenant in partnership with Islands
 Trust Fund and Salt Spring Island Conservancy
 protects habitat corridor on Mt Tuam.
- Regular work parties have been removing invasive species from HAT's protected areas, including Oak Haven and Havenwood Parks., and the Matson Conservation Area.
- After 3 years of restoration, broom infestation at Trincomali Nature Reserve has been drastically reduced.
- 3 new covenants are in progress that will protect important habitat in the Highlands, East Sooke, and Western Communities.

Green Spots: Growing Minds in Outdoor Classrooms

Green Spots helps schools and students understand and care for nature through hands-on experience.



Highlights

- HAT worked with students at Eagle View Elementary & Elizabeth Buckley School to improve natural habitat on school grounds.
- In partnership with Friends of Fern St Park, established a native plant garden at the Community Park.
- Worked with students from Selkirk Montessori to restore habitat on Ruby Creek.



Programs

Good Neighbours: Tod Creek

Through the Good Neighbours program, HAT helps people care for their land so that it cares for nature, streams, wetlands, and wildlife.



Highlights

- After a decade, HAT returned to the watershed of its first Good Neighbours Project.
- We met with over 40 landowners and provided personalized advice to help them care for nature on their land.
- Twenty households signed up to become Habitat Stewards, and commit in writing to best practices to care for nature.
- In partnership with the Friends of Tod Creek and the Victoria Green Team, HAT restored a section of Tod Creek.

Species Programs: Snakes, Slugs, Turtles, Bats and Owls

These programs help species that are facing immediate threats through education and habitat restoration.



Highlights

- A new population of endangered Bluegrey Taildroppers was located in Saanich by dedicated volunteer monitors.
- Volunteers participated in the first Annual Bat Count - recording hundreds of bats at 8 sites.
- Turtle habitat was improved at Elk-Beaver Parks and the Alberni Wetlands.
- Work began on permanently protecting a forest with Western Screech Owl habitat.



Programs

Goldstream Chums

Through the Good Neighbours program, HAT helps people care for their land so that it cares for nature, streams, wetlands, and wildlife.



Highlights

- 5000 students attended free programs at Goldstream to learn about and witness salmon spawning and Bald Eagles.
- HAT developed a colouring book for students to help them recall what they learned at the Park.
- Next year, free spring programs will also return to Goldstream Park.
- Since 2002, over 40,000 students have been able to attend environmental programs in the Park through fundraising efforts by HAT, keeping alive an iconic nature experience for Victoria students.
